

SUMMARY OUTCOMES OF CWB AWAYDAY

This table lays out the logical flow of priorities picked up in the closing discussion on 3 September. It fits well with the steer from the LGA that Boards should be moving from “making the argument” to delivery. It could represent a work programme which extends beyond one year. We need to consider how best to include member authorities in the work programme.
