Why a commission?

- Long standing question over local accountability in health care services
- Acceptance across the political spectrum that local decision making needs to be more explicit and accountable
- As the NHS becomes more devolved the need to address local accountability becomes greater to ensure
 - improvement in nature and responsiveness of services



The terms of reference

The LGA has established a cross party
 Commission to examine accountability for
 health in the context of a new consensus in
 support of a more localist approach to
 public services.



The terms of reference

The Commission will examine how to:

- Engage local people in decisions about allocation of health resources and about the delivery of services;
- Hold the healthcare commissioning and delivery system to account;



Terms of reference

- Reconcile national funding with local accountability; and
- Consider where funding for both healthcare services and public health beyond the healthcare system, should sit.

- May take into account:
 - governance, accountability
 - strategic direction
 - regulation, inspection, scrutiny
 - service delivery, improvement
 - patient & user involvement
