Membership of Outside Bodies and feedback from members

Purpose of report

For discussion / decision.

Summary

This report outlines outside bodies to which the Programme Board is asked to appoint for the 2010 / 11 meeting cycle. This report also seeks to confirm to Members appointed to the Board will not, by virtue of their appointment, incur any fiduciary duties on those outside bodies to which they are appointed.

Members that have attended recent meetings of outside bodies are also **invited** to provide any relevant oral feedback.

Recommendations

The Board is asked to:

- 1. formally appoint to outside bodies detailed at **Appendix A**
- 2. that members currently representing the Programme Board on outside bodies **provide any appropriate feedback** from recent meetings, details of which are enclosed at **Appendix B**;

- 2. Officers to confirm appointments directly to members.

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Background

1. The Local Government Group currently benefits from a wide network of member representatives on outside bodies across all Programme Boards. These appointments are reviewed on an annual basis across the Group to ensure that the aims and activities of the outside bodies remain pertinent to the LG Group.

Programme Board appointments

- 2. At the September Board meeting, Members considered and agreed the process for appointing to outside bodies, and Lead Members subsequently agreed the list of outside bodies, including ad-hominem appointments, to which the Board is recommended to appoint. A list of those outside bodies to which the Culture, Tourism and Sport Programme Board currently appoints is accordingly attached as Appendix A.
- 3. Members are therefore asked to agree the appointments to those bodies for this meeting cycle, which are to be made in proportion with political representation across the LG Group.
- 4. In order to satisfy strict proportionality, our analysis shows that compared with 2009 / 10, the Conservative Group would need to lose 1 appointment, the Liberal Democrat Group gain 1 appointment, the Labour Group gain 2 appointments and the Independent Group lose 1 appointment. This would result in 4 vacancies being filled by the Conservative Group, 3 by the Labour Group and 2 by the Liberal Democrat Group.
- 5. If Members wished to broadly confirm members who are still CTS Programme Board Members in the same roles, strict proportionality could be achieved by the Conservatives giving up 1 appointment and all parties confirming other 2010 / 11 Board Members in their 09 / 10 positions. This would leave 4 vacancies (the other 3 being created by the Rural Commission and Urban Commission Steering Committee where 09 / 10 Members are no longer Board Members and the new outside body the Local Authority World Heritage Forum to be distributed so that Labour has 3 appointments and the Liberal Democrats have 1 appointment.
- 6. Members are also asked to agree a Social Inclusion and Equalities Representative for the Board.



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7. This paper also provides members with the opportunity to **feedback** on recent meetings of outside bodies at which they have represented the Board, a list of which is **attached** as **Appendix B**.

Financial Implications

8. There are no financial implications arising directly from this report. Reasonable travel and subsistence costs will be paid by the LG Group for expenses incurred by a member appointee, whilst carrying out a representative role on an outside body on behalf of the Group.
