- Check for a shared understanding of what the service currently does, who the users and non-users are and their motivations






Mitigating the risks:2

- A Strategic Plan for the service and a route map for change






Mitigating the risks:3

Build a coherent local offer

- Hub and spoke models
- Clusters of joint-working, combined with even more localised decision making
- Arrangements for working more closely with community-led providers

Avoid falling into a deficit model

- Increased unit costs/ failure to implement change
- Capacity challenges restricting ability to problem solve and break the spiral


- Political and managerial champions

- A customer engagement plan?


Joint work on:
