LGA Group Business Plan - update

Summary

At their March meeting, members discussed the development of an LGA Group Economy and Transport Programme plan. This paper presents an updated version of the programme plan that reflects both members' comments and further officer discussions.

Members were in particular concerned about linkages between the Group's Programmes. Officers have since discussed ways of ensuring that these can be addressed through the Group structures, including the proposed Programme Boards.

The attached programme plan has been reviewed in the light of what we know about the new government's priorities, but members will wish to note that there are some areas where our Programme Plan still rests on assumptions about the government's policy that may need to be revised as the year goes on.
