Membership of Outside Bodies

Background

- The Local Government Group currently benefits from a wide network of member representatives on outside bodies across a wide range of the LG Group member structures. These appointments are reviewed on an annual basis across the Group to ensure that the aims and activities of those outside bodies remain pertinent to the LG Group.
- This report is before Members as part of the amended procedure for appointments to outside bodies agreed by the LGA Executive last year. Nominations were sought for seven places on four outside bodies, and the details are shown on the appended table (Appendix A).
- 3. In order to satisfy strict proportionality, Lead Members have agreed that the Labour Group will nominate to the LG Group Rural Commission, and confirmed other Board Members in their positions. Lead Members and political groups are currently filling this position, and the remaining vacancies on the Special Interest Groups, where these are being taken up.

Outside body appointments

- 4. A new database for centrally recording all the information relating to appointments for all member structures has been created and is held by the LGA Member Services team.
- 5. Once the Board has finalised their appointments for the 2010 / 11 meeting cycle, officers will correspond with appointed Members to ensure that they are fully informed of the arrangements for those outside bodies, including meeting frequency, meeting location, membership and terms of reference.

Financial Implications

6. There are no financial implications arising directly from this report, which is before Members for confirmation. Reasonable travel and subsistence costs will be paid by the LG Group for expenses incurred by a member appointee whilst carrying out a representative role on an outside body on behalf of the LG Group.
