Firefighters Memorial Charitable Trust



- The Firefighters Memorial Charitable Trust Fund was established in 1990
- Best known for its work in establishing the National Memorial to firefighters killed on duty and the International Service of Remembrance held in London in September each year.
- Memorial originally intended to recognise the 'ultimate sacrifice' of firefighters killed during World War II but names of those who have been killed on duty in peacetime have been added.



- The Trust is also responsible for the Chapel at the Fire Service College and also the Firefighter Memorial at the National Arboretum in Staffordshire.
- The Chairman of the Trust, former Chief Fire Officer of London Gerry Clarkson, has written to each Fire Authority seeking financial support to maintain the memorial as there is no financial assistance received from the Government for this purpose (less than £500 p.a).

- Greater Manchester, Hereford & Worcester, Leicestershire, Northumberland, Suffolk, Northern Ireland, Lancashire, Devon & Somerset and Tayside Fire Authority have already confirmed their support which is most appreciated and I know other Fire Authorities are in the process of doing so.
- Discussions are currently taking place to further explore appropriate memorials in Wales, Northern Ireland and Scotland.

- Every fire station in the UK has been written to inviting firefighters to register as members of the Trust.
- The recent Fire Brigades Union report 'In the Line of Duty' carried out by the Labour Research Department found that the most comprehensive record of firefighters deaths in the UK was that drawn up by The Firefighters Memorial Charitable Trust.

- Our Patron, HRH the Princess Royal, has supported an approach for a Royal Charter and it is hoped that this will be confirmed later this year and celebrations will coincide with the 20 year anniversary of the Trust.
- In recent years, I have personally seen the support and respect that elected members and firefighters give to fallen colleagues and their families who attend the service of remembrance.

- I would like to offer an invitation to any elected member to attend the service to see for yourself the professional manner in which fallen colleagues and the Fire & Rescue Service are represented at this service.
- This years event will take place at St Mary Le Bow, Cheapside, London on the 13th September 2009. For those who have not attended before, a church service of remembrance is conducted, followed by a wreath laying ceremony at the Firefighters Memorial in Sermon Lane, located near to St Paul's Cathedral.

 We also plan to hold the Annual Service of Thanksgiving at the Firefighters Monument at the National Arboretum in Staffordshire on Sunday the 26th April 2009.
