Local Elections & LGA Political Balance 2011/12 - supplementary

Purpose of report

For decision.

Summary

- 1. At their meeting on 18 May, the LGA Leadership Board agreed that in view of changes to the governance arrangements of Local Partnerships, the chair of the Board of 4Ps should be excluded from the allocation of chairs. This will mean one less chair to be allocated and one less voting place on the LG Group Executive. This report sets out the revised figures as a result of that change.
- 2. To maintain consistency, it is recommended that the Chair of Local Partnerships, who is elected by the Board, is invited to sit on the LG Group Executive in a non-voting capacity. This follows the same model as the chair of the Leadership centre, who is elected by the Board of Trustees and who has a non voting place on the LG Group Executive.
- 3. The final figures for 2011/12, based on data provided by the University of Plymouth are set out in **table 1** along with the 2010/11 figures. The figures include the effect of the 50% weighting for Welsh authorities, and the respective weightings for two tier areas. They exclude the seven councils now out of membership of the LGA. All figures are rounded to one decimal point.
- 4. Subject to the Leadership Board's endorsement, the political groups will need to begin negotiations to agree the allocation of chairs and vice chairs across the LG Group structures in **table 2**, and to populate all places.

Recommendations

That LGA Leadership Board endorses the proportionality figures for 2011/2012, as the basis for negotiating the allocation of chairs and vice chairs and populating all member structures.

Action

Political Groups to agree the allocation of places across all LG Group structures, including the remaining unallocated place on each of the 9 programme boards.
