# Why a review of the CDA?

- Inconsistent performance of CDRPs
- Insufficient separation of governance & executive functions
- Lack of involvement of key players
- Lack of seniority of CDRP members

## Why a review of the CDA? cont'd...

- CDRP at arms length from Council activities
- Too little external scrutiny
- CDRPs largely invisible
- CDRPs have limited influence on policing priorities

# CDA Review - Key Aims

- To strengthen the visibility, responsiveness, membership & role of CDRP
- To make them the most effective possible vehicle for tackling crime at local level

# CDA Review - How?

- Jointly with key stakeholders:  
LGA, ACPO, APA, CFOA, NHS  
Confederation
- Substantial stakeholder involvement  
throughout
- Report with recommendations to Ministers  
by end of January 2005

# CDA Review – Who, What, Where?

**Advisory Group** - broad & inclusive stakeholder representation “to advise Ministers on recommendations for change - policy & legislation” drawing on reports from:

- a) **Governance Core Group** - develop proposals on CDRP accountability, membership, inspection & community consultation;
- b) **Structures Core Group** - develop proposals on 2-tier working, co-terminosity & links with other partnerships;

- c) Delivery Core Group - develop proposals on mainstreaming & joining up crime, alcohol, drugs and ASB.

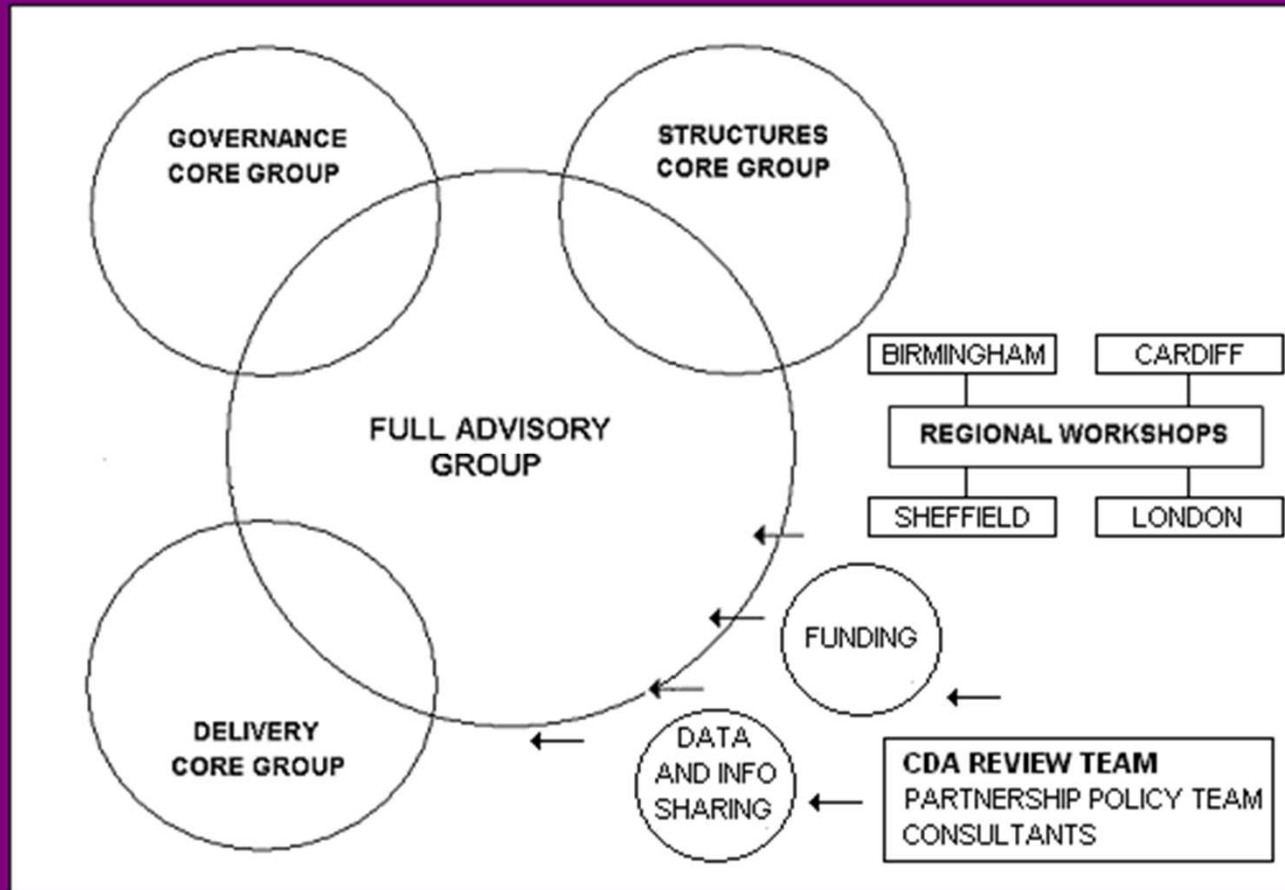
