Fire Service Proposals

- 1. In essence, there are two groups of advisors those providing support on strategic and executive management issues (almost certainly Chief Officers) and secondly specialists on various areas of service. It is suggested that the specialist core functions required are finance, legal and human resources advice.
- 2. Given the aspiration for a smaller NJC it is recommended that the LGA appoints a small group of lead advisors at this time, both for internal LGA arrangements and to support LGA Members within the NJC. When an individual work stream is demanding, particularly on specialist services, these advisors would be augmented by colleagues from the field on an agreed basis.

Strategic and Executive Management Fire Advisors

- 3. It is proposed that the following be appointed:
 - a. Ken Knight, Commissioner of LFEPA (lead advisor to the LGA)
 - b. Phil Toase, Chief Fire Officer, West Yorkshire Fire and Civil Defence Authority
 - c. Paul Woods, Chief Fire Officer, Nottinghamshire Combined Fire Authority
 - d. John Parry, Chief Fire Officer, Oxfordshire County Council

This gives a set of advisors with a range of experience in all types of Fire Authority.

Phil Toase has a senior role in CFOA and John Parry is leading for CFOA in the vital support and improvement programme initiated by the LGA, in partnership with IDeA, EO and Audit Commission.
