LGA Safer and Stronger Communities Programme Board – Governance Arrangements

Summary

This report provides an overview of proposed changes to the governance arrangements for the LGA Safer and Stronger Communities Programme Board that will come into effect in September 2010. These changes stem from proposals agreed at the LGA Executive on such arrangements as part of the 'Getting Closer' programme.

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LGA Safer and Stronger Communities Programme Board – Governance Arrangements

Background

- At the last Board meeting in May, Members agreed that the Lead Members discuss further the ways of working for the new LGA Safer and Stronger Communities Programme Board.
- 2. At their meeting on 8 June, lead members discussed:
 - How can the board ensure stronger connections to councils?
 - What might be the most effective way of working for the new board?
- 3. Following this discussion, Lead Members proposed that programme Board members should establish stronger links with member councils in their regions. The aim of the role would be for programme Board members to understand the issues and concerns that member councils would like the LGA to pursue at a national level and to act as a regional advocate for the LG Group. This will include activity such as:
 - develop relationships with community safety portfolio holders and scrutiny chairs in the region in order to inform the development of LGA lobbying positions on key issues;
 - develop strategic relationships with community safety organisations;
 - understand and influence the Regional Efficiency and Improvement Partnerships;
 - promote LGA campaign activity and lobbying successes;
 - identify good practice in their regions;
 - liaise with the other Board members in the region.
- 4. Board Members will be supported in this activity by the LGA's Community Safety Advisers network, which is chaired by Stuart Douglass.
- 5. Members will be invited to feed back progress on regional activity at formal Board meetings during the cycle.
- 6. It is proposed that current Members would be matched to their home region as follows (subject to any changes in Board membership for 2010/2011.)
